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EXTRACT OF DECISIONS TAKEN AT THE 117TH MEETING OF SENATE HELD ON WEDNESDAY, 11TH MAY, 2022/ 10 SHA'BĀN 1443 AH IN THE SENATE CHAMBER

The Senate, at its 117th meeting held on Wednesday, 11 May 2022, deliberated on many issues and took the following decisions:

1.0 Consideration of the 2021/2022 First Semester Examination Results

i. Students on Disciplinary Matters:

Senate reiterated that details of students on Disciplinary matters be made available at Senate consideration of results, having been verified at BCOS. This will prevent approving results/graduation in error.

ii. De-activation of students on suspension of study or disciplinary cases from the portal

Senate decided that students in this category be de-activated henceforth from the result portal. The ICT **should** always be COPIED in respect of students in either category whenever a decision on such students is taken.

iii. Computation of Results for Students admitted from 14 February 2022

Senate, in compliance with its earlier decision on the above subject matter, maintained that 2021/2022 First Semester results should not be computed for any of the affected students. HoDs are to remove such results and request the affected students to come for Makeup as scheduled. HoDs through Deans, should forward to VC & Registrar the list of affected students, that is, those who complied and those who may have slipped through by whatever means. Deadline 25 May 2022.

iv. Circulation of e-copy of examination results

Senate directed that e-copy of examination results after consideration by the BCOS should be circulated by the Senate secretariat to ALL members of the Senate, at least. 48 hours before the Senate meeting scheduled to consider the results.

v. 5-day interval between BCOS and the Senate meeting

Senate approved a 5-day interval between consideration of examination results at the level of BCOS and the Senate.

vi. Tying of course registration to result upload

Senate approved that Students course registration should henceforth be tied to examination results upload to ensure proper harmonization.

vii. Change in course unit value

Senate directed that any request for a change in unit value of any course should be made to Senate for consideration and approval. No course should have **different unit values** across programmes without Senate approval.

viii. Need for professional counselling of students on official and personal issues.

Senate directed that students with academic or personal challenges be referred to the University Counsellor. Senate proposed the engagement of a female counsellor to handle female students matters.

ix. Status of outstanding courses for intra and inter-University transferring students Senate decided that:

- outstanding course units from a previous programme by a transferring student would be discountenanced in the new programme except compulsory courses required for graduation.
- Compulsory/Required courses from previous university must be taken and passed if
 in consonance with Fountain University approved modules or the FUO equivalent
 taken and passed for graduation purposes.

x. Keeping Track of all students

ICT should provide an update on every student at the end of every semester; those who wrote/missed examinations.

xi. Courses registered but not sat for in the examination

A course registered for but which examination was not taken without an attenuating and approved reason will be considered a failure with zero score.

xii. Common Law

- 1. 100 level: FUO/21/0102: OLARINDE, Toheeb refused to subject himself to drug test. HoD to confirm if he wrote examination and report at next Senate.
- 2. 200 level: FUO/20/0356 IJELU, Israel Kolawole the HoD to find out why the student wrote only 3 papers.

xiii. Assignment to Business Committee of the Senate:

- 1. Provide a list of those not eligible to write the First Semester Examinations as per Senate resolutions
- 2. Those who failed to subject themselves to Drug Test
- 3. Those on Disciplinary case(s) (determined/under investigation). The Report to get to the VC by 31st May 2022.

xiv. 300 level Economics

The HoD to readjust those cut-off pages of the spreadsheet, reprint, and resubmit to Registry and ICT.

xy. 400 level Economics: FUO/18/0285 – (ADEYEMO, Sodiq Adeyinka) HoD to report on the status of the student who should also be sent for counselling.

xvi. 200 level Nursing Admissions

Acting University Librarian to find out if

• HUSSAYN, Aliyah Adejoke, FUO/20/0355 got transferred properly from Biochemistry and Nutrition to Nursing

SULAIMON, Sofiat Morayo (FUO/20/0140 --- 2.73 GPA)200L Accounting Student is known to have left school but still has results for GNS, FUO Figh among others returned in her name

Ag UL Dr. Lawal to submit report to the Vice-Chancellor by 25 May 2022.

xvii. 400 level Environmental Health Sciences

The result was approved subject to the result of ADEWUYI, Hammed Akinloye (FUO/20/0154) being stepped down.

xviii. Medical Laboratory Science

100 level - Results stepped down due to discrepancy in the credit unit computed for most students. HoD to contact the ICT for immediate correction. 200 level Result stepped down and HoD asked to clarify the observed abnormalities.

xix. Harmonization of courses chosen by students on Inter-University Transfer Students in this category should take and pass all compulsory courses as required by National Universities Commission (NUC) and as stipulated by Fountain University Handbook.

xx. Students with unclear departmental affiliation &/or Matric number Results of such students should be stepped down pending the report of the Investigation Committee which must be turned in by 25 May 2022.

xxi. Reskit package for MLS and Nursing Examination Results Senate approved the use of Reskit for the 2021/2022 Session ONLY.

xxii. Signing of spreadsheets for result Spreadsheets of Results being presented to Senate must be duly signed with Name and Date of responsible officer duly indicated.

2.0 Update on Examination Monitoring Exercise Senate reiterated its earlier directive that the Examination Monitoring Committee should forward its report on the 2021/2022 First Semester examination. The report to be submitted latest by 2 June 2022 to enable consideration at next Senate Meeting.

3.0 Commencement of Academic Activities & Examinations for Masters of Business Administration (MBA) & Postgraduate Diploma (PGD) in Management Senate adopted on compassionate ground the request for the commencement of lectures and conduct of examinations in respect of the two programmes. It however advised the Dean, School of Postgraduate Studies to ensure that PRIOR approval was obtained from the Senate before commencement of academic and other related activities in future.

4.0 Ratification of the Vice Chancellor's Approval

Senate ratified the following applications approved by the Vice-Chancellor on behalf of the Senate:

- 50% pass mark for Medical Laboratory Science Department
- Request for permission to write Make-Up examination- DUNMOYE, Michael (FUO/20/0232) 300 level Computer Science
- iii. Request for permission to add 3 extra units;
 - a. AKINTUNDE, Toyeeb Ayomide (FUO/19/0148) 400 level Computer Science
 - b. ADESHINA, Mukaila Olalekan (FUO/18/0187) 400 level Computer Science.

5.0 Update on Senate Standing Order

Senate urged the Registrar and Secretary to ensure that draft document on proposed Standing Order of Senate is share among members in preparation for its consideration at the next meeting.

6.0 Update on New Admission

Senate urged members to ADEQUATELY and WIDELY publicize the window of opportunity now opened for new Admission /Inter-University Transfer, in light of current national strike in public universities.

7.0 General Remarks on Results

- Result summary sheet should also carry a column for TOTAL number of COURSES REGISTERED for.
- ii. Courses with different unit values across programmes should be harvested and presented for harmonization by Senate.
- iii. Counselling facility should be fully utilized for students who demonstrated weak performance in CPS and others.

The manpower need of the ICT should be adequately addressed for better performance.
